Rhythms in the Real World: Translating Basic Science to Clinical, Agricultural, and Environmental Applications

The theme of the 2020 meeting reflects the extent to which biological clocks impact essentially all aspects of ecology, physiology and disease in a wide variety of species.

The SRBR meeting focuses on the relevance of biological clocks to science and society. In recent years, discoveries on the role clocks play in human health have exploded, with cutting-edge research revealing the impact of clocks on, for example, sleep, metabolism, cardiovascular disease, mental health, aging, and cancer. We have reached an exciting time, where discoveries first reported at previous SRBR meetings are now being applied to the understanding and treatment of human disease.

In addition, the SRBR meeting holds a Trainee Professional Development Day, one day prior to the start of the main meeting, which provides lectures on topics ranging from new research tools in chronobiology to mentoring and grant writing. Finally, SRBR 2020 will be preceded for the first time by the Chronobiology Summer School. Sponsor funds support the expenses of our most promising trainees to attend all of these events.
